Whatever your political philosophy, you should exercise your individual right to help choose the people who will lead our government—at the federal, state and local levels. Casting a ballot is an American right that people in many other countries don't enjoy.

But before you can vote, you must register. You can learn about registration procedures in the Voting and Elections section at USA.gov: www.usa.gov/Citizen/Topics/Voting.shtml. The site includes information to help you contact elected officials, make campaign contributions and more.

Dear Homeowners:

Election Day is quickly approaching. Because of COVID-19, Harris County is extending the early voting by an additional week and the hours of operation on Election Day will be extended because of the anticipated large turnout. The cost for expanded hours of operation and professional cleaning would be cost prohibitive Bellavita.

Harris County was looking for large voting spaces to accommodate social distancing requirements and voter turnout. Because the Ballroom is the only space which would meet their requirements and due to the fact the facilities are not open for use of our homeowners because concerns for the spread of the virus, the Board did not feel it was in the best interest of the community to allow use of our facilities for this election. Hopefully, this will not create a hardship for our residents, but it was a necessary decision not to allow hundreds to come through our doors without any screening ability.

Mail-in voting applications will be published in the newsletter and will be available for distribution at the front desk. We encourage everyone to exercise your right to vote, but to do so in the manner in which you are most comfortable.

The locations and times for early voting have not been published by Harris County at this time, but this information will be made available as soon as it is known.

Instructions for Application for Ballot by Mail

Residence Address - Give full address as shown on your voter registration certificate. If you have moved within the county but not yet changed your voter registration address with the voter registrar, indicate your new residence address.

Mail Ballot To - Give full address where you wish to have ballot mailed. If the address is different from your residence address.

Mailing Ballot to a Different Address - Your ballot must be mailed to your home where you live or to your mailing address on your voter registration certificate. There are some exceptions that allow you to have your ballot mailed to a different location as specified below.

Table with 2 columns: Reason for voting by mail, Location to mail ballot. Rows include: 65 or disabled, Nursing home, assisted living/residential center, relative, hospital; In jail; Address of jail or relative; Absent from county; Address located outside of county.

Expected Absence from County - If you choose expected absence from county, you must expect to be absent from the county on election day and during the hours of early voting in person or be mailed to an address outside the county. Important: Give date you can begin to receive mail at the address given.

Annual Application - If you are 65 years of age or older, or disabled you may apply to receive all ballots by mail for a calendar year. If you do not select any elections in Box 6a, your application will be considered an Annual Application. If you submit an annual application for a ballot by mail, your application may be forwarded to other eligible holding elections where you are a qualified voter. This means that you may receive a ballot for those elections in addition to the ballot(s) you requested with this application.

Submitting Application

1. Sign and date your application - If unable to sign, please go to Witness/Address boxes (11 on reverse) and have a person witness your mark. Witness/Assistant instructions follow below.

2. Deliver to Early Voting Clerk - You may submit your application via these methods:

In Person: Only the applicant may submit their application in person to the Early Voting Clerk until the early voting period begins. However, after the early voting period begins for an election, the applicant may only submit their application via mail, common contact carrier, fax, or e-mail.

By Mail: You may mail your application via the U.S. Postal Service.

By Common Contact Carrier: You may submit via a common or contact carrier which is a bona fide, for profit carrier.

By Fax: You may fax your application to the Early Voting Clerk. Please contact your Early Voting Clerk, or the Secretary of State's Office for fax numbers.

By E-Mail: You may e-mail a signed, scanned image of your application to the Early Voting Clerk. Please contact your Early Voting Clerk or the Secretary of State's Office for e-mail addresses.

IF YOU FAX OR E-MAIL YOUR APPLICATION TO THE EARLY VOTING CLERK, YOU MUST ALSO MAIL THE APPLICATION SO THAT THE CLERK RECEIVES IT NO LATER THAN THE FOURTH BUSINESS DAY AFTER THE CLERK RECEIVES YOUR FAXED OR E-MAILED APPLICATION. If you fax or e-mail your application by the deadline noted below, your application will be considered complete and timely as long as the original is received by the early voting clerk by the fourth business day after it was submitted by fax or e-mail.

Deadline

Your application must be received by the early voting clerk of the local entity conducting the election not later than the 11th day before election day. If the 11th day is a weekend or holiday, the deadline is the first preceding business day. You may submit an application throughout the calendar year, beginning January 1. Please remember that the application must be received not later than the 11th day before the first election in which you seek to vote by mail.

If you submit an annual application for Ballot by Mail within 60 days before an election that takes place in the following calendar year, your application will be valid for any election that takes place to the end of the preceding calendar year. This applies to Annual Applications only and not to a regular application for ballot by mail.

Witness/Assistant Section

Witness: If you are unable to sign your name (due to a physical disability or illness), the application may be signed at Box #11 for you by a Witness. You must affix your mark to the application in Box #10 or if you are unable to make a mark, then the Witness must check the appropriate box in 11 indicating the inability to make a mark. The Witness must state their name in printed form and indicate his/her relationship to you or, if unrelated, state that fact. The Witness must sign and provide his or her printed name and residence address. Unless the Witness is a close relative of the voter (parent, grandparent, spouse, child or sibling), it is a Class B misdemeanor for a person to witness more than one application for ballot by mail.

Assistant: If a person (other than a close relative or person registered to vote at the same address) assists you in completing the application in your presence or makes/assists in the application on your behalf, then that person must complete Box #11. The Assistant must sign, provide his or her printed name, and his or her residence address. A person commits a Class B misdemeanor if the person provides assistance without providing the information described above unless a close relative or registered at your address.

Use of the gym and exercise facilities is limited to homeowners and registered residents (this being defined as renters or lessees, adult children or grandchildren who are permanent residents in the home and who have been registered with the office).

The maximum occupancy is limited to 5 because of recommended social distancing. The hours of operation will continue as normal under our Rules and Regulations with access by your remote key fob.

Masks are required to enter the clubhouse but do not have to be worn while exercising. Please continue to bring your own disinfecting supplies. Please wipe off all equipment prior to use and after use.

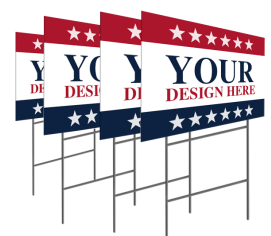
The NO ACTION form is designed to enable homeowners to make modifications to their home where there is no change to color, material, or design without waiting for ARC approval. The new form serves as a record to ensure all improvements and maintenance projects are recorded. The form is available on the website or from the Clubhouse front desk.

Homeowners, we are entering into a very contentious election cycle. There are specific Texas state statutes which govern the placement of political signs which the HOA cannot override; however, there is also specific language about lewd and offensive language which the signs cannot violate.

We want to be respectful of everyone's right to vote as their conscience dictates, but we also do not want to turn our beautiful community into a warring faction of political ideology that might be different than your own. With that being said, 4x6 political signs are allowed in your private yards based on specific state guidelines. Signs placed on common property of BellaVita or street easements are not allowed. If you have placed a sign outside your private property, please remove or it will be removed and properly disposed of.



Chapter 259.002 TEXAS ELECTION CODE



The Awards Committee would like to announce Q3 2020 Volunteer of the Quarter, Barbara Gorman and Mickey Kinzer. The Volunteer of the Quarter is a program to publicly recognize the efforts of an individual for BellaVita community service. This Quarter the Awards Committee has selected 2 volunteers since they work in tandem with each other.

Barbara Gorman and her husband Jim moved to BellaVita in December 2001. Barbara started the library in 2003 soon after the Clubhouse opened with books from her own collection. The library grew quickly because of donations from BellaVita residents and the bookshelves in the long hallway of the clubhouse and the computer room were used in addition to the shelving in the TV room. When the Annex opened, Barbara was instrumental in getting the library moved to the annex and arranged for the Paterno brothers to build and install shelving for the rapidly growing collection. Since the library has grown, due to continued donations by residents, additional shelving had to be purchased.

Barbara has arranged to take anything that can't be used, to Half Price Books for possible sale. As a result of these sales, the library has been close to self-supporting. Through these funds, smaller things such as the magazine rack, movie shelving, bookends, small bookcases and many books have been obtained. Barbara says with the assistance of several loyal volunteers including Carol Grisanti, Don Talley, Mary Hearn, Sunny Ward, Mickey Kinzer and the Clubhouse committee, the library's operation and updates have been achieved.

In addition to Barbara's dedication to the BellaVita Library, she has volunteered as an instructor for yoga and pilates, 2004-2014 (3 days/week) and gentle yoga, 2019. She has participated on the HOA Clubhouse Committee and as a Block Captain since 2004. Her volunteer efforts also include the Art group, Party Bridge, and Bowling group.

We would also like to recognize Mickey Kinzer this quarter along with Barbara. Mickey moved to BellaVita in September 2001. After she retired, she began to volunteer in the library in 2018. Her assistance has been greatly appreciated at the library. She made the book shelf labels that help everyone find what they need and makes shelving books much easier. Mickey likes to decorate and introduced flowers and seasonal decorations for the library. She also makes regular trips to Half Price Books when boxes of duplicate and rejected books have accumulated. When the library was painted, and new carpeting installed; she coordinated volunteers to move the books out and then back into the library. Mickey not only has a love of books, she also loves animals, especially dogs. In 2015, she organized a BellaVita Dog Lovers group and in 2017, she and her Border Collie started a BellaVita Dog Play Date group.

Due to the pandemic, the clubhouse and the library were closed. Mickey created a "BellaVita Library Al Fresco" which was books on the porch outside the annex. However, that had to be closed, so Mickey took it upon herself to take books, puzzles, etc. to her home and opened her garage as a satellite library for residents. When the library was opened again with some new safety regulations in place for residents, Mickey communicated to residents via BellaVita Facebook Group- Grapevine that they were open.

Barbara and Mickey see the library as an important addition to our community. They work toward improving and updating the collection for all BellaVita residents. They have done an incredible job in all their volunteer efforts. Thank you, Barbara and Mickey, for all your hard work. Please congratulate them on their outstanding contributions and recognition as Volunteers of the Quarter.

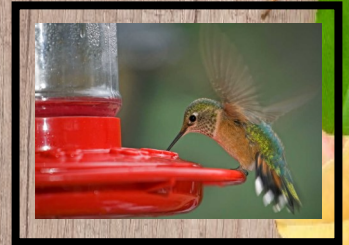


HUMMINGBIRD MIGRATION SEASON

It is hummingbird migration season so homeowners might want to put out their hummingbird feeders. Typically, we see less HBs during the fall migration, but sometimes we get some really good ones. For those who want a cost-effective way to feed hummingbirds, residents can make their own food, which helps if you need to change it often. Food should be changed at least once a week, after rain, or if it appears to be cloudy. Place feeders preferable in an open area that gets shade, but near vegetation so the hummingbirds have plenty of room to navigate. Once they have eaten enough, they will fly to a nearby tree or bush and go back and forth all day. Feeders should be 4-6 feet higher (or higher if hanging from eaves). Good luck!

Hummingbird Food Recipe:

3 parts sugar mixed with one part warm to hot water— let cool to room temperature before hanging for HBs. Excess can be stored in the refrigerator.



August and September are copperhead months — babies will be out and can be identified by the yellow tips on their trails. They usually stay in leaf litter but as youngsters are prone to do, you may see them out and about in your yard.

Opossums love to eat baby snakes, like the copperheads, and they are immune to most venoms

Front Door Maintenance

Your HOA dues includes having your front door maintained every 2 years. This means the door will be lightly sanded and a light coat of spar varnish applied. A new weather strip at the bottom of the door is included, if needed. This will help protect your door.

However, if you postpone having the work performed and the door has to be refinished (not just maintained), the HOA will only cover a portion of the refinishing and replacing the weather strip.





The HOA will pay \$130.00 (the cost to the HOA of a normal maintenance including the weather strip) plus an additional \$50.00 to cover the cost of a second coat of varnish. The homeowner will be responsible for the rest. If it has been 2 years since your door was maintained last please contact the Clubhouse 281-464-3150 to be put on the list or stop in during open hours.



ARCHITECTURAL

GUIDELINES REMINDER:

Remember to check the Architectural Guidelines before making any improvements or modifications to the exterior of your home or property. There are specific requirements for many changes.

The ARC Guidelines are on the BellaVita website along with an application which explains the time frame for approval and the documents required to be submitted.

The Rules and Regulations governing the use of BellaVita property (clubhouse, annex, pool and common grounds) state that no more than 10 guests per household are allowed. Exceptions to this rule are for Bereavement/Memorial services, private party rentals and events open to the public such as the Mistletoe Market. Your private homes are not governed by these Rules and Regulations.
